FROM THE GROUNDS COMMITTEE

October has seen wonderful growth around the course and having spiked and verticut the greens they are in good shape and currently running at 9 feet. With the season drawing to a close our focus will move to preparing greens for summer with a deeper verticut to open up the surface to ensure moisture gets through to the route systems.

The fairways are showing good growth also due to the higher cutting height and the application of the Bioboost slow release fertiliser

Around the course we have removed the Banksia tree coming down from the 16th tree (seen below) and generally cleaned up the areas where we dropped the pine trees but we have a little more work to do along the left side of the 9th fairway.

We are still on the hunt for a hose reel to make life a bit easier with hand watering so if anyone can assist it would be much appreciated.

A reminder that when removing our new flag sticks from the cups please lift them straight up as opposed to pulling them sideways. They have a locking system on them that prevents pins rotating in the cup. Thanks.

Finally we will be removing the rubbish bins from the course as the winds blow paper, wrapping, plastic bottles and coffee cups from them and around the course .We will be asking players to bring rubbish back with them to place in bins at the clubhouse area.



ETIQUETTE - NO 14

If you hit a tee shot into the woods and suspect that it might be either lost or out-of-bounds, the Rules of Golf allow you to play a second or provisional ball.

You then have five minutes from the time you reach the spot where you suspect the ball landed to find the ball. If it is not found within that five-minute period, you must declare it lost and play your provisional ball with a one-stroke penalty If, however, you play the provisional ball and subsequently find your original ball in-bounds, you must pick up your provisional and continue to play the original ball, in-bounds.

Out of bounds balls are assessed the penalty of "stroke and distance."
